


The look of things to come in 21ST-CENTURY ARCHITECTURE.

10. SUPER HOUSE

Location: To be determined **Design Team:** Superhouse/Ström Architects, *superhouse me* **Size:** 16,161 square feet plus basement

We don't think of residential architecture as stemming from boat design. In fact, it's usually the reverse. Not to Magnus Ström. "Before I set up my own practice, I worked in an office that was next door to Dubois Naval Architects, one of the most renowned designers of superyachts in the world," he says. "I was extremely impressed by the design, the engineering, and the craftsmanship, which is second to none. These yachts are not uninhabited racing machines; they are architecture on the water, providing unparalleled accommodation and comfort on board." So, Ström thought, "Why couldn't we design houses that had the same level of ambition, quality, and attention to detail, for the same discerning clientele as a superyacht customer?" Ström acknowledges that any architect—designed house is, in essence, bespoke. "But we're aiming to take it to a different level, with handcrafted solutions that will be unique to each individual Superhouse."
